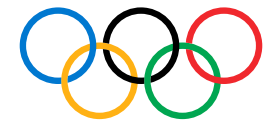

CANOE SPRINT COMPETITION

The Paris 2024 Olympic Games canoe sprint competition will take place from Tuesday 6 August 2024 to Saturday 10 August 2024 at the Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium – Flat water stadium. This competition will consist of the following 10 events:

→ Medal Events

Total number of medal events: 10

MEN (5)

- Kayak Single (K1) 1000m
- Kayak Double (K2) 500m
- Kayak Four (K4) 500m
- Canoe Single (C1) 1000m
- Canoe Double (C2) 500m

WOMEN (5)

- Kayak Single (K1) 500m
- Kayak Double (K2) 500m
- Kayak Four (K4) 500m
- Canoe Single (C1) 200m
- Canoe Double (C2) 500m

A total of 236 athletes, 118 men and 118 women, may take part in the canoe sprint competition. For details of the qualification system, see the [IOC website](#).

COMPETITION FORMAT

The canoe sprint events will take place in head-to-head races in eight (8) lanes. Depending on the number of entries, each event will consist of four (4) successive phases:

- Heats
- Quarterfinals
- Semifinals
- Final

The number of heats in each phase and the progression between phases will depend on the number of boats registered for the event.

In all the events, the gold medal, silver medal and bronze medal will be awarded in the final which will also determine the ranking from 4th to 8th place.

For events with more than 12 boats competing, a final B will be organised to determine the ranking from the 9th to 16th place.

COMPETITION VENUE

The canoe sprint will be held at the brand-new Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium, inaugurated in 2019 and located 48 kilometres to the south-east of the Olympic Village.

It will host the Olympic canoe and rowing and Paralympic Para rowing and Para canoe events. It will be abuzz with the world's most prestigious sporting event and will provide a unique stage for the Olympic and Paralympic competitions over the summer.

During the Olympic Games, the flat-water stadium will have a gross capacity of 24,000 spectators of which 12,000 in temporary stands.

→ Field of play

The Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium field of play for canoe sprint events is a 2,200-metre lake with eight (8) lanes.

The competition area and all the equipment will be installed in accordance with current ICF international rules. The warm-up and recuperation areas are situated along the south side of the competition lake.

Venue facilities

The competition venue will also have the following services and equipment:

- NOC rest areas
- changing rooms and showers (separate men's/women's)
- lounges for athletes and officials
- catering services
- Internet access
- secure space for canoe sprint equipment storage
- equipment repair services
- mixed zone where accredited media interview athletes after competition
- sport information desk
- medical facilities
- doping control station
- a living area for the canoe sprint athletes in the first week during the rowing competitions will be situated to the south of the competition venue enabling access to the water course.

TRAINING VENUES

→ Personal training before the Olympic period

The Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium will be accessible every day for training sessions that must be booked and paid for with the venue operator by each NOC (and/or its national canoe federation) according to commercial availability.

Bank transfer: All bank transfer charges must be included in each payment.

If the bank on an NF or NOC country does not make transaction with French banks, the full invoice can be paid at the venue (cash or credit card). A special request must be made in advance to the venue operator and the ICF.

CANOE SLALOM COMPETITION

The Paris 2024 Olympic Games canoe slalom competition will be held from Saturday 27 July 2024 to Monday 5 August 2024 at the Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium – White water stadium. This competition will consist of the following six (6) events:

→ Medal Events

Total number of medal events: 6

MEN (3)

- Kayak Single (MK1)
- Canoe Single (MC1)
- Kayak Cross (MX1)

WOMEN (3)

- Kayak Single (WK1)
- Canoe Single (WC1)
- Kayak Cross (WX1)

A total of 82 athletes, 41 men and 41 women, may take part in the canoe slalom competition. For details of the qualification system, see the [IOC website](#).



COMPETITION FORMAT

The canoe slalom competition includes two types of events:

- **Canoe and kayak** reintroduced on the Olympic Games programme in 1992 after a first appearance in 1972 in Munich.
- **Kayak cross** which will make its first appearance on the programme in Paris.

→ “Canoe and Kayak” events

Each **canoe and kayak** event will start with a qualification phase. All the athletes will compete in two (2) heat runs on the qualification course. The results of the best of these two (2) runs will determine which athletes will qualify for the semifinal. Based on the results of the semifinal round, the 12 best athletes will advance to the final.

For the two (2) qualification runs, athletes will start in reverse order to their position in the ICF World Rankings. In the semifinal, athletes will start in reverse order of the rank achieved in the qualification heats. In the final, athletes will start in reverse order of the rank achieved in the semifinal.

→ “Kayak Cross” events

Each **kayak cross** event will start with a time trial heat to establish the seeding of athletes in the qualification phase races.

THE QUALIFICATION PHASE IS HELD IN TWO (2) STAGES:

- First stage: A first round where the first two (2) in each race will qualify for the elimination phase and the remainder for the second stage.
- Second stage: A repechage round where, depending on the number of participants, the first two (2) or the first of each race will qualify. Still depending on the number of entries, lucky losers designated according to their results in time trial could progress to the elimination phase.
- Depending on the number of participants, the qualification phase will take place in head-to-head in races with four (4), three (3) or two (2) athletes.



THE ELIMINATION PHASE:

Each stage of the elimination phase will then take place in one (1) heat with races between four (4) athletes (except for a race with three [3] athletes in the knock-out heats if there are 33 registered for one event, or less). Each time, the top two (2) will advance to the next stage.

The stages are:

- Heats
- Quarterfinals
- Semifinals
- Small final (the 3rd and 4th in the semifinals) to award the 5th to 8th places
- Final to award the gold medal, silver medal, bronze medal and 4th place

The canoe slalom competition will be held at the brand-new Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium, inaugurated in 2019 and located 48 kilometres to the south-east of the Olympic Village. It will host the Olympic canoe and rowing and Paralympic Para rowing and Para canoe events. It will be abuzz with the world's most prestigious sporting event and will provide a unique stage for the Olympic and Paralympic competitions over the summer.

The white-water site includes a competition course, a training course and a warm-up area on calm water.

During the Olympic Games, the competition course will be equipped with temporary stands with a gross capacity of 12,000 spectators.

→ Fields of play and training and warm-up areas

The competition course has the following characteristics:

- Length: 210m
- Water flow: 13 cubic metres per second
- Drop on the course from the start line to the finish line: 3.6m

- Average slope: 1.7%
- 50 gates (for the canoe and kayak events) installed for official training
- 10 gates (for the kayak cross events) installed for official training

The competition area and all the equipment will be installed in accordance with current ICF international rules.

The training course has the following characteristics:

- Length: 160m
- Water flow: 10 cubic metres per second
- 40 gates (for the canoe and kayak events) installed for official training
- 10 gates (for the kayak cross events) installed for official training

The warm-up area will be situated in the calm-water lake and will have the following characteristics:

- Length: 160m
- Smooth current
- 40 gates installed for official training

TRAINING VENUES

ICF, Paris 2024 and the venue operator have blocked off training periods reserved exclusively for NOCs taking part in the Olympic Games:

LICF will define the programme between kayak cross and canoe & kayak at a later stage.

During these periods, the following services will be put in place by the venue operator for participants:

- two (2) one-hour training slots per day on the competition course
- the competition course equipped with at least 50 functional training gates
- the warm-up area equipped with at least 40 functional training gates
- a secure storage area for boats and trailers
- a daytime car park for participants' vehicles
- men's and women's changing rooms with toilets and showers

ICF and Paris 2024 will set up groups and the detailed training schedule.

A news bulletin will be distributed via **NocNet** for each training period by Paris 2024 after validation by the ICF and the venue operator. **This bulletin will define the:**

- booking method
- price of an hour's training per athlete
- participants' payment method based on their booking
- cancellation policies



→ Official training during the Olympic period

Each NOC may drop off sport equipment and use the rest areas at the venue from 19 July 2020 (timetable to be confirmed).

Official training will start on 20 July 2020.

Note that times may change according to training days.

There will be no training on the afternoon of the Opening Ceremony.

Before the start of the competition, the teams will be allocated two (2) sessions of one (1) hour on the competition course.

After the start of the competition, the teams will be allocated sessions on the training course outside competition times.

The training course will be closed during the competitions.
