Paris 2024 Paralympics - Paracanoe

Tomorrow, August 28, Jillian Elwart and Blake Haxton will join 4,400 athletes from 184 delegations in the heart of Paris for the 2024 Paralympic Opening Ceremony! Both athletes will then have a few days to train at the Vaires-sur-Marne Nautical Stadium before their first races on Friday, September 6.

Fans in the U.S. can watch paracanoe races and cheer on Jillian and Blake through NBC Sports and Peacock, where every event of the Summer Paralympics will be broadcast live! Jillian will make her Paralympic debut at 4:30am ET/10:30am CET on Friday September 6 for the Women's Va'a Single 200m - VL3 Heat. For Blake, this will be his third Paralympic Games. Blake competed first as a rower at the Rio 2016 Paralympics. In 2021, Blake distinguished himself in paracanoe with a second-place finish at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympics in the Men's VL2 200m event. His first race is scheduled to take place at 5:45am ET/11:45am CET on Friday, September 6 for the Men's Va'a Single 200m - VL2 Heat.

Paris 2024 Olympics - Canoe Slalom

U.S. Canoe Slalom Olympic Team members Evy Leibfarth and Casey Eichfeld raced in the Paris 2024 Olympics this summer. This was not the first Olympics for either athlete, but it was a unique Games for both. For Evy who made her Olympic debut at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, this was her first time competing in front of such an electric crowd. With a live DJ and 12,000 spectators cheering on the canoe slalom racers, this was a truly special experience for Evy who raced in her last Olympic Games in front of empty stands due to the pandemic. Paris 2024 was Casey Eichfeld's fourth Olympic Games, but his first as a father with his wife and daughter cheering him on from the stands.

Paris 2024 Olympics - Canoe Sprint

Earlier this month, Nevin Harrison added an Olympic silver medal to her collection and Jonas Ecker and Aaron Small became the first USA Men's Kayak Double to race in an Olympic A-Final in 24 years. The Women's Canoe Single 200m race ended with a photo finish for first and second place, with all three medalists breaking the previous world record. Katie Vincent of Canada finished just one-one hundredth of a second ahead of Nevin Harrison. The USA Canoe Sprint Olympic Team had incredible performances at the Paris 2024 Olympics and the ACA is so proud of this wonderful team. Look out LA28, this is only the beginning!

"I am what some people might call a "river rat", a "ski bum", a "granola girl", or even a "hippy", but I certainly do not look like the typical person one thinks of when those terms come up. When I accepted the offer to be a raft guide on the Arkansas River, I was consciously making a decision to spend my summers outdoors pursuing my passion for outdoor recreation and education. Unconsciously, I was embarking on a journey of empowerment and resistance against racist and prejudice institutions." — Jamilah Toure


