Your Backcountry Paddling is at Risk—USDA Plans to Rescind the Roadless Rule

The USDA has announced plans to rescind the Roadless Area Conservation Rule, threatening 58 million acres of pristine National Forest lands that have been protected since 2001. These wild landscapes—home to treasured paddling destinations like the South Fork Salmon (ID), Upper Chattooga (GA), and Laurel Fork of the Potomac (VA)—could soon be opened to road building, logging, and resource extraction.

For paddlers, this means more than lost access—it risks the health of headwater streams, threatens water quality, and undermines the unique backcountry experiences we treasure.

Support <u>American Whitewater's</u> efforts to defend these wild places. Urge Congress to pass the Roadless Area Conservation Act of 2025 and make your voice heard before it's too late.

The U.S. Canoe Slalom Team made waves at the 2024 ICF Junior and U23 World Championships in Foix, France, bringing home multiple medals, breakthrough performances, and a bold new move that's changing the game.

Hot off her first World Cup gold, Evy Leibfarth earned the U23 World Champion title in Women's C1, took silver in K1, and joined the U23 Women's K1 Team—alongside Ria Sribar and Marcella Altman—to place third in the team event and earn a bronze medal. On the men's side, Kaelin Friedenson stunned the field with a never-before-seen kickflip in Kayak Cross, an innovation drawing international attention. 16-year-old Carden Oetting impressed with a 4th-place finish in Junior C1 and 9th in K1. From rising stars to technical trailblazers, the future of U.S. slalom looks bright.
