Outdoor Alliance Rallies the Outdoor Community to Save 500,000 Acres of Public Land

Last week, the outdoor recreation community came together to defeat the sale of 500,000 acres of public land that were part of a massive spending bill in Congress.

Outdoor Alliance sent over 100,000 letters to lawmakers that said, "public lands should be managed for people and the future." This was a significant win for bikers, hikers, skiers, paddlers, hunters, climbers, and proof that advocacy from the outdoor recreation community works. Unfortunately, the rest of the bill includes a number of provisions that are BAD for America's public lands and waters, including giveaways for oil and gas companies, rollbacks on environmental reviews and old growth protections, and it opens up the Boundary Waters for mining.

The bill goes to the Senate next, which means there's time to make your voice heard again—it takes just two minutes!

For the fourth year in a row, ACA volunteers joined forces with local paddling leaders to deliver beginner-friendly paddling classes to kick off National Safe Boating Week. This initiative, recognized in 2024 with the Community Impact Award from the National Safe Boating Council, brings paddlers, volunteers, and organizations together to help beginners learn safe paddling skills and foster connections within the paddling community.

Each location offered hands-on instruction designed for new paddlers, ensuring that beginners learned essential skills such as basic strokes, safety procedures, and local waterway knowledge. Many locations also featured community-building elements such as group paddles, environmental stewardship discussions, and family-friendly activities to encourage participation.

The partnership highlights diverse aspects of paddlesports, with specialized offerings including kayak fishing courses, adaptive paddling sessions, river kayak day trips, and youth-focused classes led by ACA Instructor Trainer Chris Wing, and assisted by ACA Competition Director Jed Hinkley and U.S. Slalom National Team members, Bug Lokken and Marcella Altman.

United States Kicks off International Sprint Racing Season in Europe

U.S. Sprint and Paracanoe Teams Members began their international racing season in Europe this May at the first two ICF Sprint World Cups of the new Olympic/Paralympic cycle. The U.S. Team then traveled to Poznan, Poland for windy conditions and more competitive racing. There the team was joined by U.S. Paracanoe National Team member, Michael Ballard who raced in the Men's KL2 200m event in his first major international race of the season.

Stout competition for all athletes and the U.S. Team had a strong start to the season. The next big international race is the Junior and U23 World Championships that will take place in Montermor-o-Velho, July 23-27.



# U.S. Canoe Slalom & Kayak Cross National Team Prepares for the International Race Season

As the U.S. Canoe Slalom & Kayak Cross National Team sets its sights on the ICF Canoe Slalom World Cups the new Olympic cycle this coming June—La Seu, Spain (June 6-8), Pau, France (June 13-15), and Prague, Czechia (June 27-29)—the team is primed to test itself against the world's best.

The team's preparation has included the comprehensive support from US Performance Center in Charlotte, NC. A hub of elite athletic development, the center brings together state-of-the-art facilities, expert coaching, integrated medical and performance support, and a community of driven athletes. For Men's Kayak athlete Tyler Westfall, who recently participated in athlete testing at the facility said that the impact has been transformative. It's about sharpening their skills, testing new strategies, and leveraging the unique support system that places them among the world's elite.
